11.00 – 12.30 Visit to the Palace of Grand Dukes of Lithuania (for foreign guests and upon registration only) Venue: National Museum – Palace of the Grand Dukes of Lithuania, Cathedral Square 4

The reconstructed Palace of the Grand Dukes of Lithuania, the former political, diplomatic, cultural centre of the State, was one of the most famous in Europe in the 15th-17th centuries and was demolished in the beginning of the 19th century. Currently there are two exhibition tour routes directly related to the historical functions of the Palace. The first tour route reveals the historical and architectural development of the Palace by highlighting the ancient ruins still in place, while the second tour route brings into the ceremonial halls, which have been reconstructed to illustrate the evolution of architectural styles – from the late Gothic to the Renaissance to the early Baroque.
